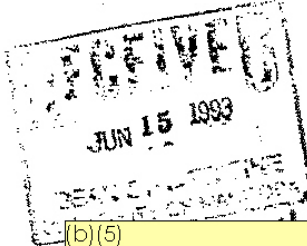

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Dear President Naimark:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the action of the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) and to transmit formally to you the report of the team representing the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools (CACMS) and the LCME which conducted a limited accreditation survey of the University of Manitoba Faculty of Medicine on March 29-31, 1993.

At its meeting of June 2, 1993, the LCME reviewed the report of its survey team and took the following actions:

1. Continued accreditation of the program of medical education leading to the M.D. degree.
2. Requested that the dean of the Faculty of Medicine submit a report to both LCME Secretaries and to the Secretary of the CACMS by May 1, 1994, on the following items:
  - a. The ratified affiliation agreement between the University and St. Boniface Hospital that meets accreditation requirements. A copy should be provided.
  - b. The role and performance of the curriculum committee in management and evaluation to assure a coherent and coordinated curriculum and to evaluate educational program effectiveness by documenting the achievement of students and graduates in verifiable and internally consistent ways that show the extent to which institutional and program purposes are met.
  - c. The system for, and results of, the curriculum committee's continuing examination of the quality and consistency of educational experiences, faculty supervision and teaching, and the evaluation of students across sites of clinical instruction.
  - d. The system for, and results of, the curriculum committee's oversight of the methods of evaluating and grading students and the use of multiple measures of performance.
