Dear Chancellor Modica:

I write concerning the New York State Education Department's 1998 review of the program of medical education at St. George's University School of Medicine.

Based on the report of the site-visit team, I am pleased to approve the program of medical education at St. George's University School of Medicine for the purpose of placing students in clinical clerkships in the University's affiliated hospitals in New York State through January 31, 2008. This approval applies to the placement of clinical clerks at Beth Israel Medical Center, New York City; The Brookdale Hospital Medical Center, Brooklyn; The Brooklyn Hospital, Brooklyn; Coney Island Hospital, Brooklyn; The Jamaica Hospital Medical Center, Jamaica; Lutheran Medical Center, Brooklyn; Maimonides Medical Center, Brooklyn; Manhattan Psychiatric Center, Manhattan; Metropolitan Hospital, New York City; Mount Vernon Hospital, Mount Vernon; Methodist Hospital, Brooklyn; Long Island College Hospital, Brooklyn; St. John's Episcopal Hospital South Shore, Far Rockaway; Sound Shore Medical Center, New Rochelle; and Southside Hospital, Bay Shore. However, should the medical school sign acceptable affiliation agreements with other teaching hospitals, we will be pleased to review them on an individual basis and extend this approval to include them.

Continuation of this approval beyond January 31, 2008 will be dependent upon the results of the Department's next formal review, to occur in 2007 at a time mutually convenient to the University and the Department, and upon the favorable review of an interim report, to be submitted to the Department no later than January 1, 2006. The interim report should focus on the observations, findings, and recommendations of the team as described in the site-visit report's summary. My approval is also granted with the understanding that the Department retains the prerogative of undertaking an interim visit in 2006 at the University's expense, should this be deemed necessary, based upon the review of the interim report.

We appreciate the cooperation you and your colleagues have extended the Department during the evaluation process. It is our desire to maintain a mutually helpful and effective relationship. If there is any way in which we can further this goal, please let us know.
